Portfolio Description

This portfolio is a well-diversified portfolio of global securities, which may include companies from all countries including the United States. This portfolio looks to provide investors with consistent, competitive performance through favorable stock selection while monitoring risk. The Portfolio typically invests in a globally-diversified portfolio that includes a combination of both large-cap “growth” stocks and “value” stocks. Growth stocks are companies whose earnings are expected to grow at an above-average rate relative to the market. Value stocks are companies that trade at a lower price compared to the market average, as measured by valuation ratios that compare the stock’s price to the company’s earnings and growth trends. Large companies are generally considered to be more stable, but may not have the fast growth potential of smaller companies or the ability to respond as quickly to competitive challenges and changing market conditions.


Investment Strategy/Process

The Portfolio invests at least 80% of its net assets in equity securities of domestic and international companies and invests approximately 40% of net assets in foreign assets under normal market conditions. The portfolio management team seeks to add value through stock selection and active management, and monitors risk in an effort to build a well-diversified, global portfolio. The team uses fundamental, quantitative, and technical investment research techniques to identify and purchase financially-sound companies that appear to have strong, long-term growth prospects and capable management teams.

MSCI All Country World Index - USD Net Returns




