Portfolio Description

This portfolio looks to provide investors with consistent, competitive performance through favorable stock selection while monitoring risk. The Portfolio typically invests in large company "growth" stocks. Growth stocks are companies whose earnings are expected to grow at an above-average rate relative to the market. Large companies are generally considered to be more stable, but may not have the fast growth potential of smaller companies or the ability to respond as quickly to competitive challenges and changing market conditions.

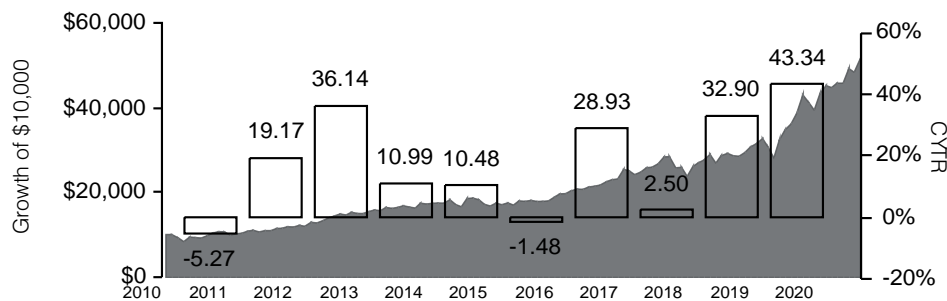
Investment Strategy/Process

The portfolio management team seeks to add value through stock selection and active management, and monitors risk in an effort to build a well-diversified portfolio. Analysts identify securities that they believe may provide strong, long-term, organic growth opportunities, or that are uniquely positioned within the industry. Each analyst uses a proprietary research process, considering the factors and characteristics that are most relevant for each industry. The analyst teams "best ideas" in each sector are presented to the portfolio management team as candidates for the portfolio. The Portfolio's portfolio managers are responsible for portfolio construction and risk management. Variances in the portfolio's sector weightings compared to the benchmark are minimized in an effort to ensure that stock selection is the primary source of excess return.

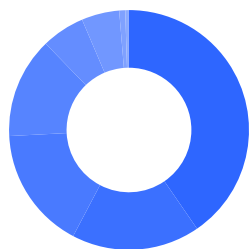
